The 2022 Annual Conference session will be held starting at 10:30 a.m. on Thursday, June 16 to noon on Saturday, June 18, in person, at the Hampton Convention Center based on John 4:24 (CEB):

The Annual Conference Planning Team, in partnership with Bishop Lewis and conference planner Neal Wise, continues to plan for the 240th session of the Virginia Annual Conference to be in-person.



The Planning Team and conference leadership have continued to monitor the COVID pandemic: positivity rate, hospitalizations, surges, and new variants.

Of the utmost importance is the health and safety of all members and guests attending Annual Conference 2022. At this time, the Planning Team

remains confident the meeting can proceed forward in-person, but plans for pivoting to a virtual Annual Conference, should it be deemed necessary, are in place.

As the date of the conference gets closer, the Planning Team will share more about any COVID protocols that conference members and guests can expect while attending Remote viewing of worship services and the sessions of the Virginia Annual Conference, June 16-18 in Hampton, VA, will be available. In **Mozambique** we provide support for Theological Education for Leaders ministry while in **Brazil**, our efforts support the Shade and Water Ministry. In **Cambodia** our focus is on support for street children and making Cambodia a provisional methodist denomination.

Offerings collected through the 2022 Annual Conference will be distributed evenly among the causes.

Blood Drive May 23rd

Many thanks to everyone who donated blood at our January drive and contributed to the collection of 31 units of blood. Our next drive with Inova Blood Donor Services (IBDS) will be on Monday, May 23, 2022, from 2:00 – 7:00 pm in the Fellowship Hall. This is the Monday before Memorial Day weekend, when the demand for blood is likely to be high. You are eligible to donate if you are in



good health, weigh at least 110 pounds, are at least 17 years



old (16 with parental consent), and will not have donated whole blood since March 28. Currently, IBDS's supply of all 8 types of blood is low. You can help by being a donor on May 23.

Estate planning is not only for the wealthy, it is for everyone. It is simply the process of deciding where your assets should be distributed after your death. The plan is implemented through a will or a revocable living trust.

For many people a revocable living trust is an excellent tool through which to implement their estate plan. Like a will, a trust makes provision for the transfer of your assets at the time of your death. Unlike a will, assets in the trust are usually not subject to the costs and delays of probate. During your lifetime the trust remains completely under your control.

Many people who have supported their church throughout their lifetime want to make sure that part of their estate goes to support their church at their death. A gift to the St. Stephen's Permanent Endowment Fund would be used to support the ministries of St. Stephen's UMC in future years.

The assistance of your attorney or financial planner is suggested.
