Most of us know that our year ends on December 31 and the New Year begins on January 1, at least when talking about our regular calendar. Some companies and institutions run their budgets on a different calendar, a fiscal year, from July 1 to June 30. Many other cultures even have their own ways of marking time. The Christian church (speaking beyond denominations) does as well, and we call it the liturgical calendar. Our Christian calendar year begins on the first Sunday of Advent and concludes after Christ the King Sunday. So you might say that Nov 27, 2022, begins a

seasons of Christ's life as well as many themes of our faith as covered in the Old and New Testaments. We start the year by getting ready for the birth of Jesus and end the year reflecting on the fullness of His rule and reign.

At the end of the year, we get ready for his return, which is called the Second Coming. This way of marking time helps us to not rush through or skip over essential elements of our faith. Our inclination is to jump from big moment to big moment, over looking the smaller, yet significant, seasons of faith. Advent does that for us. Rather than jumping into Christmas with both feet, we slow it down a little to anticipate and appreciate the fullness of the Coming of Christ. While many others are focused on presents and Santa, we pause to consider the reason behind the season. More than considering the birth of Jesus, but also why God sends us the Messiah. In the midst of the "holly jolly" and the "hustle and bustle", remember to take the time to consider the reason behind the season.

"For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, so that everyone who believes in him may not perish but may have eternal life.

"Indeed, God did not send the Son into the world to condemn the world but in order that the world might be saved through him.

Sing the carols. Go to the parties. Wrap the presents. However, prepare your heart for the babe in a manger, who is destined to be King of all creation.

# **Chocolate Eclair Torte**

- 2 small boxes instant vanilla pudding
- 3 1/4 cups milk
- 1( 8 or 9 oz) container of Cool Whip. Don't overdo. It dilutes pudding.
- 1 box of graham crackers

Mix pudding with 3 1/4 cups milk till well blended. Let set 10-15 minutes. Then add the Cool Whip. Grease a 9x13 in pan with butter and line bottom with graham crackers. Layer with pudding, then a layer of crackers, the remainder of the pudding and a final layer of crackers Top with frosting. Refrigerate. It can be made a day early.

Frosting: Melt 1 square of unsweetened chocolate (I use Bakers brand) and the squares are small so I use four, add 3 tbsp melted butter,1 tsp vanilla. Slowly add to chocolate mixture 1 1/2 cups of powered sugar (sifted to be sure there are no lumps) and 2 tbsp milk. Stir until smooth. Frost over the top layer of graham crackers. Refrigerate until time to serve. Yum!!!

Our family is a little finicky about dessert but everyone likes this one. It isn't original with me. Many military wives I know have been sharing the recipe for years.

# Manger Ministry: Your Gift that Gives all Year

As we have done for the past 7 years, St. Stephen's is dedicating the Christmas Eve offering to helping those who are homeless find a home. We call this offering our Manger Ministry because when Jesus was born, his family was homeless too. This is a gift that gives so much.

With funds raised through the Manger Ministry, St. Stephen's work with the nonprofit organization, Homestretch, to cover the costs of providing one to two homeless families with housing as they go through Homestretch's two-year program. Homestretch aims to empower homeless families to move from crisis to long-term stability and financial independence. During their time with Homestretch, parents work at a job and pay a percentage of their rent so that they can complete the program with an affordable home and savings in the bank. Homestretch helps with transportation and child care costs and provides education in financial, vocational, and parenting skills.

In the past 7 years, St. Stephen's has sponsored a number of families who have gone on to complete the Homestretch program and move into successful jobs and housing. We give out of our love for God; we give as a gift for Jesus; we give to grow in our relationship with God and one another. ## **Mom's Molasses Cookies**

- 3/4 cup shortening (I prefer butter)
- 1 cup sugar
- 1/4 cup molasses
- 1 egg
- 2 cups sifted all-purpose flour
- 2 tsp baking soda
- 1 tsp cinnamon
- 1/2 tsp ground cloves
- 1/2 tsp ginger
- 1/2 tsp salt
- 1/2 tsp nutmeg (optional, I omit)
- Sugar for rolling dough in (I like raw sugar but white works)

Cream shortening and sugar. Add molasses and egg and beat well. Sift together all dry ingredients. Add dry mixture to first mixture and mix together. Chill (at least several hours or overnight)

Form into balls and roll in sugar; bake on greased cookie sheet @ 375 degrees for 8-10 min (bake less for chewy, more for snap like crunch).

## **Tembleque**

(Puerto Rican Christmas dessert-coconut custard)

- 2 cups coconut milk
- 1/3 cup cornstarch
- 1/4 teaspoon salt
- 3/4 cup sugar
- 1 tablespoon orange blossom water (optional-found at middle eastern grocery stores)

Combine and dissolve all the ingredients in a medium sized saucepan that is not on the stove.

Choose 2 -3 small/medium bowl or mold. Rinse bowl/molds in cold water. Place them in the fridge for 30-60 mins.

Place saucepan on medium heat, stir constantly until mixture bubbles (5 minutes). Pour mixture into molds. Place in the fridge for 3 hours. Invert mold onto a serving platter. sprinkle with cinnamon on top. Slice and serve.
